The NOLB Stage 1 intervention is a program, within Scottish Borders Council, for 16-24 year old's who are not in employment, education or training. We offer

young people the opportunity to participate in an Employability and Progression Plan, which is tailored around the strengths of the individual, removing barriers to help them to successfully move onto the stage of their journey.

Employability Fund Stage Two

Stage 2 provides individuals with employability training through a blended learning approach of face to face sessions and virtual training. Individuals have the

opportunity to obtain accredited qualifications in employment, personal development, core skills and/or customer care.



Employability Fund Stage Three

Stage 3 provides opportunities to gain eight weeks of work experience in a real working environment. During this time individuals have the opportunity to gain

employment based qualifications along with valuable work based skills.





KICKSTART



The Kickstart Scheme is a 6-month paid job with a local employer, funded by the Government. It provides fully funded job opportunities for young people to gain experience of working in some of Britain's most exciting companies. All Kickstart jobs are a minimum of 25-hours per week though some offer full time hours. Not only will you be in a paid 6-month job, you will also receive additional employability support to help boost your future employment prospects.

In order to be eligible all you have to do is sign up to Universal Credit and discuss any relevant job opportunities with your work coach.
