

During the month of May, DYW Borders delivered a bespoke 3-day **STEP (Senior Transitions Employability Programme)** in partnership with employers and stakeholders over the course of 2 weeks to young people across the Borders. Each of the 9 schools identified pupils who would benefit from the programme and they took part in a variety of interactive virtual sessions ranging from cooking on a budget to appropriately dressing for an interview. On completion of the 3-day programme, each pupil received a **Dynamic Youth Award**, approved by CLD.

The first week of June saw a range of keen future design and architect pupils participate in a 1-week virtual work placement with CSY, where they designed their ideal classroom in a post COVID environment. 




WE STARTED A CHANNEL


