FUTURE AT DYW BORDERS

The main focus of the role will be to bring industry alive in the classroom and support pupils to develop their employability and work readiness skills. Previously, DYW have been involved in supporting some great activities with each of the 9 high schools, including Mentoring, Career Fairs, Meet the Expert sessions, STEM events and delivering industry relevant experiences.

There will be some great opportunities available, and we hope that by working alongside the staff and the pupils the coordinator will be able to deliver some of these valuable interactions in and around the school.

During the month of May, DYW Borders delivered a bespoke 3-day STEP (Senior Transitions Employability Programme) in partnership with employers and stakeholders over the course of 2 weeks to young people across the Borders. Each of the 9 schools identified pupils who would benefit from the programme and they took part in a variety of interactive virtual sessions ranging from cooking on a budget to appropriately dressing for an interview. On completion of the 3-day programme, each pupil received a Dynamic Youth Award, approved by CLD.

The first week of June saw a range of keen future design and architect pupils participate in a 1-week virtual work placement with CSY, where they designed their ideal classroom in a post COVID environment. Each pupil produced a fantastic design and we are very impressed with all the work from everyone who took part.

Faculty Flyers. Since March, when schools were still operating in a virtual home learning world, DYW Borders began to issue daily flyers to each of the different faculties. This meant that for every day for 2 weeks on a rotational basis each faculty were receiving a relevant flyer with resources that would benefit teachers and pupils in their virtual-home learning experience. These resources included events from DYW Live, Esgoil, E-DYW and many other valuable materials. These have been very well received and as a result DYW Borders continue to create and distribute these. Following on from these flyers, DYW Borders are aiming to create monthly faculty events which have stemmed from this original idea.




